The Adventure of Cub Scouting is provided by **dedicated volunteers**, usually parents, who are supported by district staff, volunteers and chartered partners.

The Cub Scout Promise and Motto emphasize serving others, doing your best, and duty to God and country. Too often in our society today winning is the main emphasis for young people.

Cub Scouting also fulfills its purpose through **outdoor activities**, (promoting physical fitness), **advancement** (increasing self-esteem and confidence) and by providing **positive role models**.

On the next few pages, you'll learn more about the Cub Scouting program and how you and your boy can get involved to enjoy all that Scouting has to offer.

The structure of Cub Scouting is important, too. Cub Scouting is family-oriented, Cub Scout activities are intended for the whole family to participate - parents, brothers, sisters and even grandparents. Your boy will work with you on many of his Cub Scout projects and award requirements. Many skills he will learn are family and home related.

If your boy is in a Tiger Cub Den, you will experience a concept of shared leadership. The Tiger Cub Den Leader provides experience and continuity throughout the program year. Tiger Cubs is based on shared leadership, each month a different adult partner will be working with the Tiger Cub Den to plan the two to three den meetings for that month. They will also organize the participation of the boys in the monthly pack meeting.

Your boy is also part of a Cub Scout den - a group of 5 to 8 boys from his grade at school. Each den is led by a volunteer den leader and assistants. The group meets weekly for games, crafts, and other fun activities.

Your boy's den is part of our Cub Scout pack. The pack is made up of all the different dens from our pack. Once a month all our dens gather together for a pack meeting. The whole family is invited. At the pack meeting, boys have an opportunity to receive the awards they have earned and show their den's skits and songs.

Our Cub pack is supported by a group of parents of which you can be a part, called the pack committee.

CUB SCOUT SPECIAL ACTIVITIES

in which you and your

- * **Good Turn** - This is a pack service project to benefit the community, such as a park clean up, food shelf collection, or tree planting!
 - * **Pinewood Derby** - Parent and son work together to build a gravity-powered miniature race car from a special kit. Most packs conduct the derby races annually.
 - * **Blue and Gold Banquet** - This is a birthday party for your Cub Scout pack usually held in February. Most often it is a seated dinner, but sometimes it is a covered-dish supper. A special program or entertainment is customary.
 - * **Religious Emblem** - Have your son learn more about your family's faith. This program will encourage a stronger appreciation and understanding for his belief in God and the church to which you belong.
 - * **Cub Scout Day Camp** - Day Camp is an exciting summertime activity that includes archery, BB guns, crafts, games, sports, songs, and skits. This one or two day program is held at a council camp facility. Cub Scout Day Camp is an excellent way to introduce youth to the outdoors and teach them new skills. It also helps strengthen the pack's summer program.
 - * **Cub Adventure Camps** (offered in the spring and fall)– A one day and one night experience with plenty of fun, adventure, activity, and advancement opportunities. Your day will include activities such as bb guns, archery, crafts, games and hiking.
 - * **Fun with Son** (two day, one night camp) **and Cub Scout Overnight Camp** (three day, two night camp) – Fun with Son and the Cub Scout Resident Camp are opportunities for Cub Scouts and accompanying parent or guardian to spend quality time together at camp. Program activities include: outdoor cooking, swimming, nature, crafts, Scouting skills, and much more.
- Cubs will be placed in dens according to their age, participating in age-appropriate activities that relate to their next rank.
- * **Webelos Resident Camp** (three day, two night camp for boys going into 4th & 5th grade)– Provides fun, adventure, activities and Activity Badge Advancements for all Webelos Scouts, their parents and leaders.
 - * **Cub Scout Family Award** – This unique optional program provides recognition to families for spending quality time together.
 - * **Boys' Life Magazine** - This magazine, for boys and adults, has interesting features on Scouting, sports, hobbies, magic, science, and U.S. history. There are also jokes, comics, and short stories. The price is one-half of the regular cover price per year for members.
- Boys' Life has three separate editions, depending on the age of the youth:
1. Tiger Cub and Cub Scout subscribers through age eight.
 2. All other Cub Scout, Webelos Scout, and adult subscribers registered in the Cub Scout program.
 3. Boy Scouts and all other subscribers.



THE ADVANCEMENT PLAN

The responsibility for a boy's earning of awards in Cub Scouting lies with the family and not with the pack. Some advancement requirements are done at den meetings, but most are completed at home with the family.

The Cub Scout Advancement Program is an excellent way for you to spend quality time with your boy. For each special skill or activity your boy completes with you, you can sign off one of the requirements he needs to earn his next award. As a result, the awards he earns raise his self-esteem and confidence.

You can be a part of it by participating in the Cub Scout program with him. The rank awards he earns are listed below. Other optional opportunities for advancement include the Sports and Academics Program, the Religious Emblem Program and the Cub Scout Family Award Program.

TIGER:

In the Tiger Cub program, for 1st grade boys, there are 5 achievements leading to the Tiger Cub badge. There are also 50 electives from which a Tiger can choose. These electives and achievements are all designed for a Tiger to enjoy the Scouting program with his family and friends.



Belt Totem: When the boys learn the Tiger Cub Motto, Cub Scout Salute, and Cub Scout Sign, the Pack presents them with a specially designed Tiger Paw Belt Totem.

Totem Beads: Tigers earn white beads for family activities, orange beads for den activities, and black beads for attending "Go See It" activities. These are displayed on his Belt Totem.

BOBCAT:



Earned by ALL NEW Wolf, Bear, and Webelos Scouts (Tigers start working on this badge in the spring). All boys, regardless of age, earn the Bobcat badge first by learning the Cub Scout Promise, Law of the pack, handshake, salute, sign, motto, and the meaning of "Webelos", and read the booklet *How to Protect your Children from Child Abuse*. After receiving the Bobcat badge, the boy works on requirements based on his grade or age.

WOLF: (2nd graders)

A Cub Scout who has completed 1st grade (or is age 8), works on 12 achievements to earn the Wolf badge. Each achievement is designed to teach simple skills and initiate family discussions on values, drug awareness, health, etc.



BEAR: (3rd graders)

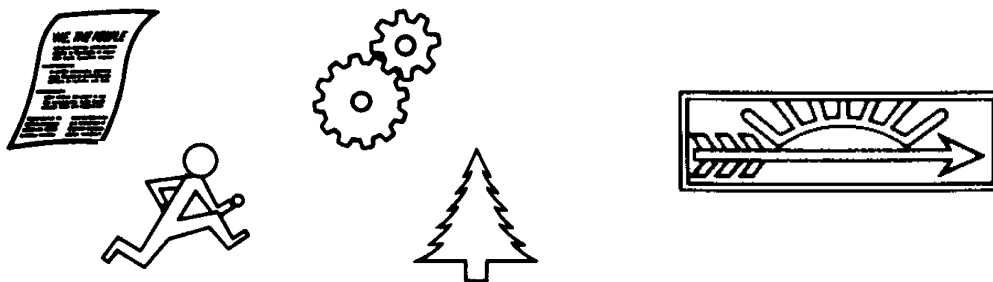
A Cub Scout who has completed 2nd grade (or is age 9), works at completing 12 of 24 achievements to earn the Bear Badge.



After he earns his Wolf or Bear badge, a boy may work on electives (arrow points) in different interest areas until he is old enough to begin work on the next rank. For every 10 electives a boy completes, he earns an Arrow Point. A boy may earn as many Arrow Points as he wishes. Parents help boys learn more complicated life skills and values.

WEBELOS SCOUTS: (4th and 5th graders)

When a Cub Scout has completed the 3rd grade (or becomes 10 years old), he advances to a Webelos den, led by an adult Webelos leader. The boy works on requirements for the Webelos badge, 20 activity badges, and the Arrow of Light Award (the highest award in Cub Scouting) which prepares him for Boy Scouting.



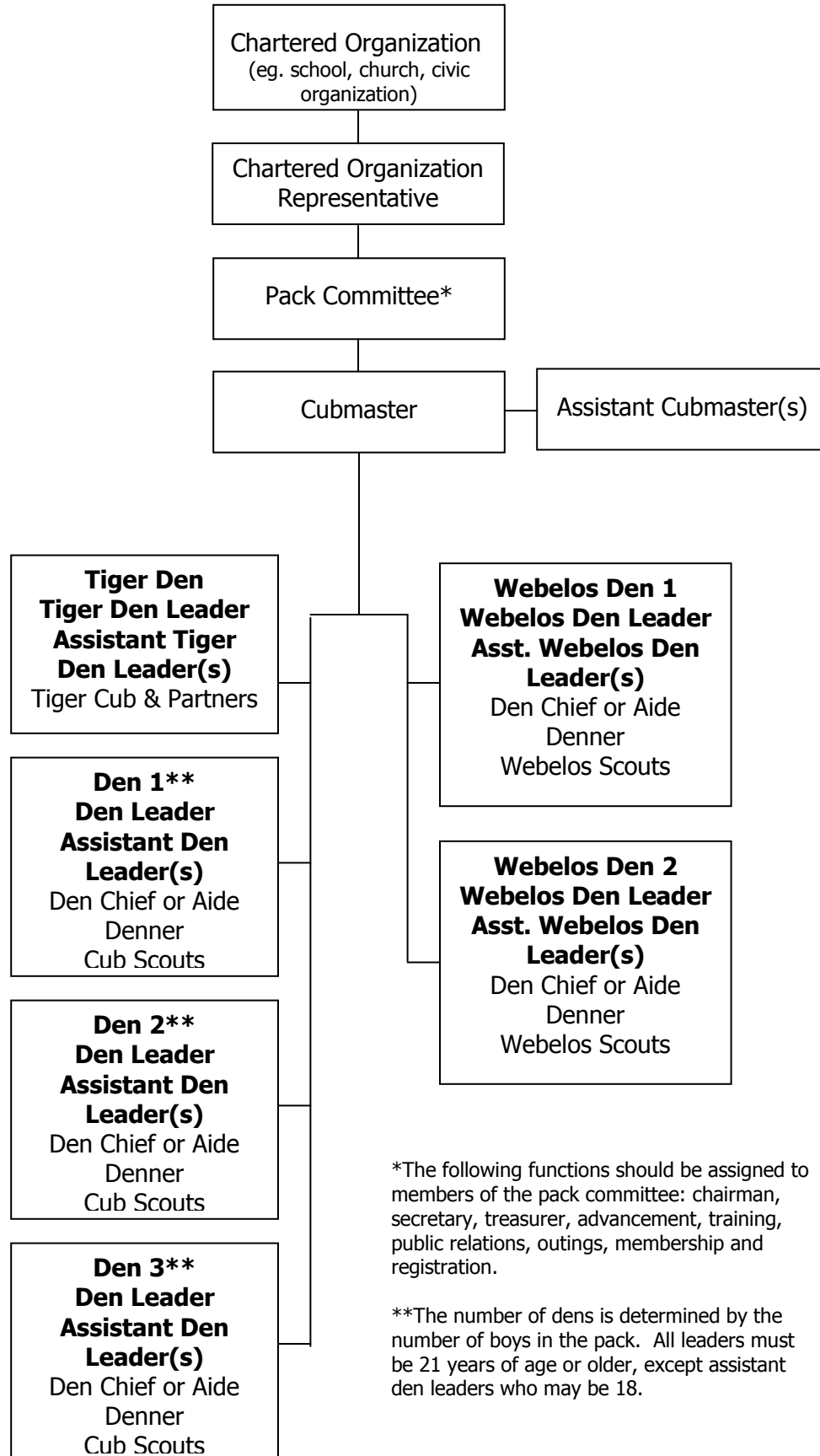
BOY SCOUTS:



When a boy earns the Arrow of Light or reaches 11 years of age or completes the fifth grade, he graduates from Cub Scouting to Boy Scouting at an impressive graduation ceremony. Every Webelos Scout is encouraged to continue on into Boy Scouting. Generally, your son will be prepared to join a Boy Scout troop in February or March of his fifth grade year.

What You Should do now to Get Started in Cub Scouting . . .

- Carefully review this booklet so you know what Cub Scouting is all about and how you and your boy can get the most out of it.
- Purchase a Cub Scout Book now for your boy's rank and begin doing the activities in it with your boy, especially those related to the outdoors. Books, uniforms and other supplies are available from the shop at the Earl Q. Gray Scout Service Center in Ardmore (411 Hwy142 West, PO Box 5309 or call 580-223-0831).
- Find out what activities your Den will be doing in the next few months and put the dates on your calendar.
- Find out when the pack meets and what kind of activities your Cub Scout pack is doing in the next few months, and put them on your calendar so you can participate.
- For Tiger Cubs, be sure to work on the family Tiger rank requirements at home with your boy.
- Fill out the parent talent survey on the last page of this booklet and turn it in tonight so you can share your knowledge, experience, and skills with the youth in your boy's den and the pack.
- Scouting is more fun with friends! Every boy can become a Cub Scout at any time, not just on Join Scouting Night. Talk to other parents and youth and have them join your boy's Cub Scout den now to make Cub Scouting even more fun.
- Consider becoming a Cub Scout leader for your boy's Cub Scout den. Your boy's experience in Cub Scouting depends on your involvement. Details are on Pages 13, 14 and 15 of this book.
- Purchase a Cub Scout shirt for your son to wear his awards on. Be sure to get a size large enough to last several years as your boy grows.

How Can You Help?

Scouting operates through volunteer leadership. Volunteer Cub Scout leaders are an example of Scouting's principle of service to others. Naturally, parents are a primary source of leaders in the Scouting program. You volunteer not only to serve Scouting, but also to serve your boy and his friends, and to have the chance to be a positive influence on the youth in your community.

What Do You Receive in Return?

YOU ARE NOT ALONE

- ***Cub Scout and Webelos Scout Program Helps*** contains meeting plans for dens and packs and shows you how to do crafts and games. All registered leaders working with Cub Scouts or Webelos receive Program Helps in Scouting magazine.
- ***Monthly Roundtable Meetings*** for all adult Cub Scout volunteers are held. Participants receive help with crafts, games, skits, and songs for use at den and pack meetings. It's a great place to ask questions, share ideas and network with other leaders.
- Your district provides ***Basic Leader Training*** available. All leaders need training! The pack will help you with Fast Start training. Fast Start training is also available on-line at www.coronadoscout.org.
- Your district has another volunteer crew called the ***Commissioner Staff***. Individuals on this staff serve as a service crew. They check on the health of your pack and are a communications link between your pack and the Scouting organization.
- Each district is served by a full-time ***District Executive*** that works with an average of about 400 volunteers.
- Staff members at the local ***Scouting service center*** can help or put you in touch with someone who can help you succeed.

TRAINING FOR THE NEW CUB SCOUT LEADER



CUB SCOUT ORIENTATION:

This is an orientation video for all new parents of Cub Scouts. The video provides an overview of all phases of the Scouting program. Available from your pack or from the Scout office, 785-827-4461.

CUB SCOUT LEADER FAST START TRAINING:

Fast Start Training is a brief introduction to the Cub Scout program that will equip you with the basic skills and information that you will need as a new Cub Scout leader. Fast Start Training is available via the website www.coronadoscout.org or also in the form of a VHS video tape with 20 minute segments for the Cubmaster, Den Leaders, Webelos Den Leader, and basic Pack Organization. Your pack committee might have a copy of their own that you may borrow or copies are available for check out from the Scout Office PH: (785) 827-4461. Fast Start Training sessions may also be offered by your district. Check with your district Cub Scout Training Chair listed for dates and locations.

CUB SCOUT LEADER BASIC TRAINING:

The essential training course for all Cub Scout leaders. Basic Training covers the topics of den and pack meeting planning, pack finance and management, and special activity planning. The training includes special break-out sessions for each leader's position. Dates and times for the courses offered this fall are listed in this booklet. You may attend any course that is convenient for you. All Cub Scout leaders should attend Basic Training to provide a quality program to the Cub Scouts in your pack.

MONTHLY ROUNDTABLES:

Supplemental training offered each month for all Cub Scout leaders to provide additional den and pack meeting ideas. New Cub Scout leaders will find a wealth of information and activities to use with the Cub Scouts in the pack. This is a fun-learning evening!

BASIC ADULT LEADER OUTDOOR ORIENTATION (BALOO):

An outdoor skills training program for the New Cub Scout Leader or parent who has minimal camping experience. (Other pack leaders are welcome to attend this entry-level course.)

YOUTH PROTECTION TRAINING:

The BSA's nationally recognized Youth Protection Training is important to insure the safety of youth and the protection of all volunteers. This training is available on-line at www.coronadoscout.org.

UNIVERSITY OF SCOUTING:

University of Scouting is an all-day training opportunity that covers items such as crafts, skits, puppets, workshops, displays, demonstrations, games, Blue and Gold Banquets, pack administration, Webelos Scout activities, Cub Scout sports, special pack activities, and other Cub Scouting resources. University of Scouting is usually held on the first Saturday of November.

VOLUNTEER POSITIONS IN THE PACK

(Remember, Scouting works because of volunteers like you!)

CHARTERED ORGANIZATION REPRESENTATIVE (CR):

- Selects Committee Chair, Cubmaster. Approves all other adult registration applications.
- Serves as a liaison between the Scouting unit, chartered partner and the district /council.



COMMITTEE CHAIR (CC):

- Conducts monthly committee meetings.
- Delegates responsibilities to committee members.
- Responsible for all necessary “paperwork” including new membership enrollment, adult leadership enrollment, Boy’s Life subscriptions and rechartering.

CUBMASTER (CM):

- Serve as Master of Ceremonies for monthly pack meetings.
- Recruit and work directly with Assistant Cubmaster, Den Leaders, and Webelos Leaders.

PACK TRAINER (PT):

- Encourage pack leaders to attend ongoing training, such as roundtable, Pow Wow or University of Scouting; outdoor training; Youth Protection training; and Wood Badge.

TIGER CUB DEN LEADER (TL): First Grade

- Coordinate shared leadership among adult partners in the den. Get everyone involved!
- Work with shared leadership to plan den activities focused on the Cub Scout monthly theme.

DEN LEADER (DL): 2nd or 3rd Grades – and - WEBELOS DEN LEADER (WL): 4th or 5th Grades

- Lead den in participation at monthly pack meetings; serve as den host or hostess to den parents.

COMMITTEE MEMBERS (MC):

- Provide “behind the scenes” support for the pack.
- Attend basic training.
- Various positions as follows:
 - ✓ Secretary/Treasurer
 - ✓ Advancement
 - ✓ Publicity
 - ✓ Outings
 - ✓ Membership and Reregistration
 - ✓ Friends of Scouting Fund Raising Drive

PARENT HELPERS:

- Each year the pack will undertake several short-term projects. Parents and other volunteers are needed for activities such as pack fund raisers (popcorn sale, pancake breakfast or similar events), Scouting for Food, pack Good Turn, Pinewood Derby, Blue and Gold Banquet, Friends of Scouting, pack graduation, and day camp. These jobs are of short duration and still enable all families to assist with pack responsibilities.

OTHER POSITIONS AVAILABLE:

- Assistant Cubmaster (CA) to help with program plan. Required to be a Quality Unit.
- Assistant Den Leaders (DA) to help with den activities.
