



## Fort A.P. Hill, Virginia July 26 – August 4, 2010

### Attention: Webelos Scouts, Boy Scouts, and leaders!

A National Scout Jamboree happens once every four years and the next one is in 2010. A Jamboree is ten days of non-stop fun, activity and unique experiences that will provide opportunities for Scouts to be challenged and enriched. The Jamboree experience has something for everyone: Activity Centers containing climbing, repelling, BMX and shooting sports; aquatic activity like sailing, canoeing, fishing, snorkeling and Scuba diving. A Merit Badge Midway where every BSA Merit Badge is represented and many other things you will find nowhere else.

Arbuckle Area Council is planning to send one Troop of 36 Scouts & 4 leaders to Fort A.P. Hill, Virginia, the site of the 2010 National Scout Jamboree that will take place on July 26 – August 4, 2010. The trip will include two days touring the Washington DC area prior to the Jamboree and ten days at the Jamboree.

We are offering you a chance to save a space with a \$100 Hold-a-Space deposit. The total fee for our Council is projected to be \$1800 per person (This is difficult to judge at this time, and is our best guess as fuel costs keep going up. We hope to adjust down if possible). The fee will cover the National Jamboree fee, all transportation, all troop and patrol equipment, all meals and the program in the Jamboree. You will need to supply uniforms, personal equipment and your own personal spending money.

**Requirements:** There are two basic eligibility requirements to attend the Jamboree:

- 1) Scouts must be the age of 12 before leaving for the Jamboree. This means that if you were born "on or after" August 5, 1992 or "before" July 26, 1998 you are eligible to attend. Cub Scouts who became Webelos Scouts in 2007 can be eligible.
- 2) Scouts must have attained the Boy Scout Rank of 1<sup>st</sup> Class prior to leaving for the Jamboree.

**Registration:** The registration is \$10 for the National Office, and \$100 to hold your place in the group. Please send \$110 to make the complete registration. The \$10 National registration is non-refundable. Please fill out the form below and send it to the council office. Alternatively, you can come by the council office and register in person.

**SPECIAL NOTE:** The next National Scout Jamboree will not be until 2014. If you will be 14 or older by August 2010, this is your **ONLY** chance to attend as a **Scout**, because you will be 18 or older for the next Jamboree.

## Requirements for Boy Scouts

- > Have completed the sixth grade, or be at least 12 years of age and a First Class Scout by July 1, 2010, but not have reached your 18<sup>th</sup> birthday by August 5<sup>th</sup>, 2010
- > Participate in the required, overnight pre-Jamboree training experience.
- > File a completed personal health and medical record, No. NSJ-34412, prior to the pre-Jamboree training.
- > Have been active in a troop for at least six months prior to July 1, 2010
- > Agree to follow the Jamboree code of conduct
- > Be approved by his Scoutmaster
- > Be approved by the Council National Scout Jamboree Committee

## Adult Requirements for Jamboree Troop

The Council Jamboree Committee has selected the 4 adult leaders. The national council sets the minimum requirements for qualified leaders and as such we do not have the authority to waive or modify them in any way. The requirements for all adult leaders are: participate in the required pre-Jamboree training experience, file a personal health and medical record prior to the pre-Jamboree training, participate in the Youth Protection Guidelines for Volunteer Leaders and Parents for Basic Training, be approved by the local council, meet the service requirement specific to the position:

- > **Third Assistant Scoutmaster:** Wes Weaver, Assistant Scoutmaster, Troop 112, Chickasaw District (580-222-8828).

## Fees

The Arbuckle Area Council is working very hard to keep the fee for the Jamboree as affordable as possible for the Scouts who will attend. It is anticipated to cost around \$1800 to attend the 2010 National Jamboree, a lot of which is in transportation cost due to high fuel prices. Boy Scouts living on the West Coast will pay up to three times this amount. Now is the time to sign up and start saving for the Jamboree. The process for which scouts are selected to attend will be competitive, and date of application is one of the criteria. If you are interested, get your deposit in NOW.

## Refund Policy

If you register for the Jamboree and then cannot attend, you will receive a refund less of \$100 administration fee from the Council ONLY if there is an alternate to take your place. You may also be removed from the roster if you become more than two payments behind from the payment schedule. Your deposit will be refunded in full if you are not selected as a member of this Troop. Also, we reserve the right to refund all fees to an applicant if he is found to be problematic or incompatible for this experience.

## How to Register
